	What are we going to be doing and how could you help at home?		
English	What we are doing	This term we will be looking at developing our understanding of vocabulary, as well as improving the structure of our non-fiction writing. We will be completing several pieces of fiction writing based on Greek mythology. Following this, we will be developing our historical knowledge to write a newspaper, stories and reports.	
	How can you help?	 Support your child in practicing their spellings daily in a variety of ways - on the journey to and from school, at home or on the way to somewhere for a nice trip. Children could follow the strategy of Look, Cover, Write, Check, creating mnemonics or silly ways to remember spellings, follow the spelling rules or any other way that suits. Listen to your child read and ask them questions (retrieval and inference based) about what they are reading. Please read with your child five times per week and record this in the Home / School diary daily. Stickers are awarded each Monday for children achieving this. 	
Maths	What we are doing	The children will cover a range of multiplication and division written methods. We will study fractions, decimals and percentages and the relationship between the three. Finally, we will be improving our understanding of perimeter and area, as well as statistics.	
	How can you help?	 Practice x-table facts up to 12 x 12. All maths activities are related to times-tables knowledge; please help your child to recall these accurately and fluently. Log on to TTRockstars on a weekly basis to earn points for new outfits as well as improving the speed of recall! 'Telling the Time' does not feature in the Year 5/6 curriculum as it has been taught in all previous years and is assumed they can read digital and analogue clocks. Please continue to ask your child quick questions on these regularly, as well as questions about durations of time, to ensure they are secure with this concept. 	
Science	What we are doing	We want our children to foster a great curiosity in Science. In Science, your child will be learning about living things and their habitats this half term. Next half term, we will be studying forces.
