Mathematic facts – Practice mathematical facts with pupils, do they know their timetables

- ✓ Play games that include maths
- ✓ Bake with your child using scales as weights and measures
- ✓ Use game to help with times tables – we use times table rock stars here
- ✓ Get outside and measure distances
- ✓ Identify shapes in your own environment
- ✓ Ask pupils to work out the change when buying items in a shop
- ✓ Practice basic number understanding – number bonds, how many cm in a m etc.

Writing and stories – Practice , make writing fun and engaging.

- ✓ Tell stories out loud
- ✓ Draw stories and act them out
- ✓ Write a sentence each
- ✓ Model using punctuation correctly
- ✓ Read books and make up alternative endings
- ✓ Pretend to be the character in a story and write own version
- ✓ Write outside
- ✓ Practice phonic sounds



Reading is one of the single most important activities you can do to support your child's learning and development.

- ✓ Go with interests – show an interest
- ✓ Read a line each – listen to your child
- ✓ Read to your child
- ✓ Explore picture books and invent stories of your own
- ✓ Act out the pages
- ✓ Build into a routine – stories before bed
- ✓ Read with pets and relatives
- ✓ Make it fun

Get out and about

Give children opportunities to get out and about and have time away from screens. Have fun in the outdoors and create learning opportunities in nature

- ✓ Mini beats hunt
- ✓ Rain fall – collecting it to water plants
- ✓ Plant growth and life cycles
- ✓ Healthy bodies – what happens when we exercise
- ✓ Friendship and playing games with friends and siblings
- ✓ Environmental awareness
- ✓ Places of historical significance.
